There is no pre-booking required.

You do not need to attend all Sundays.

Just come along and bring your flute. You can also listen if you wish.

ABOUT Greenland Music

Greenland Music is a project (soon to be a charity) based at the Grade II* listed Greenland Fishery building in King's Lynn, now home to the composer and improviser Stevie Wishart. Inspired by ways to revive and celebrate this special building, the project exists to build a creative eco-system around composition and early and contemporary music by listening to nature and thinking about how we can sustain it.

This includes occasional concerts and collaborations with other composers and musicians in the Greenland Fishery Music Room, a micro-venue within the Fishery building.
